AUSTIN, Texas - In light of the recent comments made by the presumptive Republican Presidential Nominee, Republican Chairman, Florida State Senator Rene Garcia, and the Board of Hispanic Caucus Chairs (BHCC) completely rebuke the harmful and misguided remarks.
